

Spring snow delays Moriah roadside cleanup

MORIAH — The Town of Moriah Earth Day Roadside Cleanup has been delayed because most roadsides in the town still have a heavy blanket of snow. Organizer David V. Bruce spoke with Town Supervisor Tom Scozzafava and the volunteers will instead do the cleanup Saturday, April 28.

Volunteers are asked to notify the supervisor's office at 546-8631 or St. Patrick's 546-7254 if they can wait until then so the Highway Department can pick up trash that has been collected.

"Nearly 300 youths and adults throughout the town have made a commitment to make a difference for their community," Bruce said in a news release.

"The town board, Highway Commissioner Wilson and Supervisor Scozzafava have been extremely cooperative and are very pleased with the response to the Earth Day event."

NEXUS cards can be used at Montreal airport

MONTREAL — NEXUS cardholders can now use their cards at Trudeau International Airport in Montreal. A press release from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's U.S. Customs and Border Protection Division said the airport is the third in Canada to offer NEXUS services to travelers. The others are Vancouver International Airport and Toronto Pearson International Airport.

The NEXUS program allows pre-screened, low-risk travelers to be processed with little or no delay by U.S. or Canadian border officials. It is also offered at 11 land border crossings, including the Champlain-Lacolle Port of Entry.

"The NEXUS program is a tangible example of the longstanding friendship and partnership that exists between the United States and Canada," Customs and Border Protection Commissioner W. Ralph Basham said in the news release.

"We share the mutual goals of securing our borders and protecting our citizens while facilitating the legitimate flow of trade and travel that is an inherent — and critical — part of our shared border."

More than 120,000 people are enrolled in the program. NEXUS cards are expected to be an acceptable substitute for passports when the Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative is implemented, possibly by January 2008.
