

## Westport has fight on its hands to defend title: 3 teams poised to take run at reigning MVAC champions

The Westport baseball team didn't stop with one title last season. The Eagles won two. Westport captured the Mountain & Valley Athletic Conference Northern Division championship with a 10-1 record and then went on to add the Section VII Class D crown.

The Eagles figure to be a title contender again, but there will be plenty of competition for the top spot with several other teams, including Chazy, Elizabethtown-Lewis and Crown Point, returning talented veterans.

### Chazy

The biggest strength for the Eagles this season is the return of four starters, including three-year performer Andrew Goodwin.

Chazy, which should be a major factor in the MVAC North, will be looking for leadership from four seniors — Goodwin, outfielder Kasey Trombley, shortstop Evan Green and first baseman Kenny Boire.

The Eagles return a solid nucleus with 13 players.

Other returning starters include three juniors — outfielder Kyle Reynolds, pitcher/third baseman Nolan Ryan and catcher Jacob Beeman.

Leading the way for Westport will be returning MVAC North First Team selections Will Maclver (shortstop/pitcher) and Adam Robare (outfield/catcher/pitcher), along with Second Team picks Travis Turnbull (first base/pitcher) and Ben Sherman (third base/pitcher), and all-division honorable mention Josh Stevens (catcher/second base).

Senior outfielder/infielder Curtis Viens also returns as a starter.

Sophomores Michael Tyler and Zach Sherman were on the varsity last season and are projected as starters this time around.

Will Maclver, Robare, Turnbull and Ben Sherman will anchor the pitching staff for Westport, which will have strong senior leadership following the successful season of a year ago.

The Eagles, who will need some of their players to adjust to different positions, have good team speed and depth.

Westport expects to be able to score its share of runs.

Playing solid defense and how well their pitchers throw the ball, however, will determine how good the Eagles will be.
