The Chiefs scored eight runs in the top of the second and rolled to a 14-6 victory over Plattsburgh High School in Champlain Valley Athletic Conference non-league play at Lefty Wilson Field. Nick Desroches hit a third-inning homer deep to left field for the Chiefs, and was the lone player from either team with two hits.
