Plattsburgh — Albert Paul Mack, 73, died Friday, May 4, 2001, at the CVPH Medical Center in Plattsburgh.

He was born in Brooklyn on Dec. 4, 1927, the son of Paul and Margaret (Bacousin) Maczko. He served in the U.S. Navy during World War II. He attended R.P.I. from 1950 to 1952 and later attended the UNIVAC school for the Department of Defense.

He was dedicated to scientific research and had a special interest in astrophysics. He owned several copyrights with the Library of Congress and Oxford. He owned and operated Plattsburgh Television for many years.

He is survived by a son and daughter-in-law, Steve and Sheila Mack of Plattsburgh; his grandchildren, Stephanie and Joshua Kisner, Stephen and Stacia Mack and Shelise and Samantha Mack, all of Plattsburgh; two nephews, Richard and Ronnie Maschak of Westchester; a brother-in-law, Michael Maschak of Westchester; and his companion, Sandra Tremblay of Plattsburgh.

His wife, Kathryn M. Mack, died in 1985. A brother, Andrew Mack and a sister, Marion Maschak also died earlier.

Calling hours will be held on Sunday from 7 to 9 p.m. at the O'Neill-Redden-Drown Funeral Home in Plattsburgh. A funeral service will be held on Monday at 3 p.m. from the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints in Plattsburgh, with Bishop Michael Jensen officiating.
