Reber Centenarian — Alton T. Wrisley, 100, died at his home in Reber, N.Y., on May 5, 2005. He was born in Deerhead on Sept. 15, 1904, the son of Henry and Lucy (Cross) Wrisley. Alton was a dairy farmer until 1960. His love for horses and carpentry provided both work and enjoyment in later years. He enjoyed his family and friends and his home was a gathering place for many special occasions - two recent ones being the celebrations of his 100th birthday and his and Marie's 76th wedding anniversary.

Alton enjoyed traveling and with his wife Marie made many trips throughout the United States and Canada and several countries after retirement.
