Alva was a member of the Board of Directors for Homemaker Services of Clinton County and served as president between 1967-68; the Board of Directors for the Joint Council for Economic Opportunity in 1967; the Tri-County Council for the Aging 1967-68; and was district vice chairman of the New York State Advisory Committee of Vocational Rehabilitation Services, 1967-69. She was associated with the Girl Scouts and the Beta Sigma Phi Sorority, Eta Iota Chapter, Plattsburgh. She was a volunteer for the Cancer and Heart Associations, the Christmas Bureau, the Association of Retarded Children and the Community Chest. Alva was an avid painter and loved to sing. Alva is survived by a son and daughter-in-law, K. Joe and Joyce Channell of Plattsburgh, a daughter, Nancy Channell of Cornwall on the Hudson, a daughter, Marjorie Quattrini of Tonawanda, a daughter and son-in-law, Jill and Carl Dattel of Manassas, Va.; three grandsons, Todd Channell of Plattsburgh, Jeff Quattrini of Akron, Tim Quattrini of Tonawanda; two granddaughters, Kelly Citro and her husband Brian of Essex Junction, Vt., Erin Quattrini of Cheektowaga; four great-grandchildren, Ryan Perry of Essex Junction, Vt., Brady, Molly and Riley Channell and their mother Beth, all of Plattsburgh.
